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President's Comments – March 2018

March has been a very busy month for me. Much to my surprise, I attended 3 different classes in Agility as well as participated in the inaugural meeting of the Dallas Factor Analysis of Information Risk (FAIR) chapter. My journey began on Saturday, March 10 when I attended a breakfast meeting of the Dallas Chapter of the Project Management Institute (PMI). The session was titled DevOps: Advantage for Business Agility. We've all heard of DevOps, Agile, and Scrum but what does this mean for us as continuity professionals? We have an excellent opportunity to utilize our skills by incorporating continuity practices with DevOps and

Agile. Introducing your talent early in adoption is key. We are all masters at collaboration and for me personally, that has been the only way I have been able to work my way into projects and initiatives. Continuity design and implementation will be much more difficult if left to the end, much like we experience with non-DevOps/Agile environments of today. The danger of leaving continuity protection planning until the end will absolutely increase costs and risk for our companies. In my view of the world, Agile is for software development with DevOps being the Agile for infrastructure. Both are required to deliver software and technology solutions to our internal/external customers.

Mid-March I was fortunate to attend a 2 day course titled Leading SAFe – Applying a Lean-Agile mindset with SAFe (Scaled Agile Framework). It is amazing how much our continuity skill set can augment adoption, implementation, and execution of these methodologies. Consider reading the Agile Manifesto. Don't wait! Jump on the bandwagon or you will be left behind.

For those of you who are members of PMI, consider taking the PMI Agile 101 training. I attended this 4 hour training session which was excellent. Liam Davidson (aka "Red" – yes he is a ginger!) from Toyota was amazing in sharing his expertise with Scrum Agile while the group practice simulations reinforced the concepts.

My learning journey was well rounded this month with the introduction to DevOps and Agile, the training in SAFe methodology, and reinforced with the PMI Agile 101. I am grateful the universe laid this training out so well for me.

Let me now switch gears to FAIR (Factor Analysis of Information Risk). I was introduced last year to the FAIR risk methodology where risk is a derived value that represents loss exposure. Simply put, FAIR is a methodology to *quantify* risks. Traditional methods for risk management usually boil down to qualitative opinion that are based on a set of learned assumptions. Complicating this varied interpretation of traditional risk methods is the fact that not everyone's assumptions are the same. Consider learning about FAIR (which, by the way, originated within a company headquartered in Dallas!). There is no cost in learning about FAIR, [www.fairinstitute.org](http://www.fairinstitute.org). As the chapter grows, consider joining the Greater Dallas-Fort Worth chapter of the FAIR institute.

There is a wealth of information at the tips of your fingers. The world is changing. To keep pace, you've got to adopt an attitude of lifelong learning. Only you can jump on the bandwagon, embrace new concepts and technologies, and implement the habit of self-learning. Enhance your ability to ensure your enterprise is resilient. Don't wait. Act now!
